


From the Principal

All Lutheran Schools of Australia, including Sunshine Christian School, have adopted ten important values we believe are important lifelong qualities for all members of community. Year 7 Enrolments 2021



In the Year 1/2 classroom we are learning about the value of Australian money. You can help your child to count and order collections of coins and notes according to their value.




Yr 5/6


Grade 3/4 – Making Decimal Numbers from MAB Blocks

We know that decimal numbers can be made up of wholes, tenths and hundredths.







We created these decimal numbers using our MAB Blocks.

3. Tell the story of your painting.






Parking Restrictions

Marian College operates a non-selective enrolment policy. The College serves a multi-cultural and multi-faith community, and enrolment patterns reflect the nature of the community served.

The Marian College Enrolment Policy and the application and enrolment process follow the enrolment policies and guidelines of the Catholic Education Office and the Brigidine Schools Secondary Council "Policy for Enrolment in a Brigidine School".

Enrolling at Marian College

A Prospectus containing an Application for Enrolment form, policies and curriculum information is available on request. An Application for Enrolment is usually lodged when a student is in Year 5 in 2019. However, applications will be accepted earlier.
